

2022 FOX CORPORATION POLITICAL ACTIVITIES REPORT

Published January 2023

Fox Corporation engages in political activity in accordance with the Company's Political Activities Policy, which is supervised by the Nominating and Corporate Governance Committee of the Board of Directors. The Committee reviews and oversees this report, which outlines the Company's engagement efforts in four areas of corporate political activity: the FOX Political Action Committee (FOXPAC); corporate political contributions; lobbying activities and expenditures by FOX; and the Company's participation in trade associations and contributions to non-profit entities.

I. FOX POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE

FOXPAC is the official federal political action committee for FOX and its subsidiaries. It is registered with the Federal Election Commission. FOXPAC solicits funds from permissible Company employees (except those in news gathering functions) and in turn uses those employee donations to make political contributions to candidates in support of the Company's policy priorities. No corporate treasury funds are used for contributions from FOXPAC. FOXPAC is committed to maintaining an even 50/50 balance between the two major political parties in making federal political contributions.

In 2022, FOXPAC disbursements totaled \$258,000 evenly divided between Republicans and Democrats. Recipients of FOXPAC support in 2022 were:

III. LOBBYING ACTIVITIES

FOX employs government relations experts to advocate on behalf of the Company, its

businesses, and its employees. The lobbying activities of FOX Government Relations, in many cases, are required by law to be disclosed at the federal, state and local level with the respective agency or government entity overseeing lobbying compliance.

In 2022, FOX Government Relations advocated on a wide array of policy issues impacting the Company, including the First Amendment guarantee of a free press, retransmission consent and programming carriage, business insurance and liability protection, children's educational TV programming, advertising and corporate taxes, spectrum, intellectual property and copyright, media ownership, online privacy, Section 230 of the Communications Decency Act, antitrust enforcement and reform, and sports betting and sports futures.

In 2022, FOX's federal lobbying expenses, as defined by the Lobbying Disclosure Act, totaled \$3,830,000, which includes the relevant portion of employee salaries and travel expenses, and outside expenditures associated with lobbying activity.

FOX employs four executives who are charged with the Company's government relations activities and who are registered federal lobbyists under the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995. They are: Daniel O'Brien, Executive Vice President and Head of Global Government Relations; Kristopher Jones, Senior Vice President of Government Relations; Jamie Gillespie, Senior Vice President of Government Relations; and Carissa Smith, Vice President of Government Relations. FOX also retained consulting services in 2022 from the following firms that engage in federal lobbying activity as defined by the Lobbying Disclosure Act:

IV. INDUSTRY TRADE ORGANIZATIONS AND NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

FOX and its business units maintain membership in relevant industry trade organizations to advance the Company's commercial and policy objectives, with an eye toward improving industry dialogue among stakeholders with aligned interests. Fees paid in 2022 to such organizations are for general membership dues and not earmarked for direct or grassroots lobbying. In 2022, membership dues paid by FOX included:

As part of its philanthropy, community engagement, and social responsibility programs, FOX contributes to non-profit entities across the country, with a focus on veterans and first responders and their families, underserved students and the teachers who support them, and disaster relief efforts. For example, in 2022, the Company contributed \$2.5 million to the American Red Cross in support of hurricane relief operations and Ukraine relief efforts. FOX also contributed an upgrade and expansion of the FOX Sports Skybox and Plaza to the U.S. Armed Forces service members stationed at Al Udeid Air Base in Qatar – a gift valued at \$2 million and approved by the U.S. Department of Defense. A separate U.S. VETS initiative saw FOX donate in-kind media reaching more than 100,000,000 viewers in addition to a \$100,000 donation to the "Make Camo Your Cause" Campaign. FOX also expanded its "FOX for Students" initiative, donating approximately \$500,000 to enhance growth in the arts, creativity and storytelling and the opportunity for hands on learning experiences in media and entertainment. FOX for Students supported The Roybal Film and Television Magnet School and over a dozen other Los Angeles Unified School District schools. In December, FOX donated \$1 million as a founding sponsor of the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Latino.
